

After reviewing all the recommendations from the CDC and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, we feel confident that we will be able to offer a safe, healthy and enjoyable camp experience for your child. The spacious grounds of our camp along with the safety protocols we have in place enables us to create our own protected environment. We are committed to opening and feel that kids need camp more than ever. The program we offer at Camp Pocono Trails is very important for our campers wellbeing and needed by many after being home and isolated for so long! We are putting all of the best safety protocols in place to make sure our campers can enjoy a fun and healthy summer. Our commitment to our core Camp Pocono Trails programs will remain as it has in the past to continue to encourage our campers to reach their personal goals and make new friendships while at camp!

Some of the protocols we will be implementing this summer include:

- Prior to camp campers and staff are required to quarantine for 14 days at home prior to arrival. During this time campers and staff will also need to complete a 14 day prescreening checklist which includes daily temperature checks.
- All campers and staff will have a health interview upon arrival to camp which will also include a temperature check.
- We will require clearance from the doctor that your child is healthy to attend overnight summer camp. (Telehealth will be acceptable.)
- Campers and staff will be required to be tested for Covid-19 prior to arriving at camp. Once they arrive to camp they will be tested again on camp 3-5 days after arrival.
- We will continue to test throughout the summer for campers and staff displaying symptoms to ensure camp is Covid-19 free.
- Campers parents and staff will be required to sign a Covid-19 waiver prior to camp.
- We will be doing daily temperature checks for everyone at camp
- Campers and staff will be required to wash their hands throughout the course of the day.
- Cabins will be deep cleaned and disinfected daily.
- Public areas will be deep cleaned and disinfected daily.
- Hand sanitizer units will be located all throughout camp.
- We will have campers and staff attending camp from different geographical areas this summer. All campers and staff will need to follow the CDC safety guidelines during travel to camp and remain supervised during travel at all times.

- We will not be able to transport campers from the airport this summer. Parents or guardians must drive their campers to camp.
- We will not be offering any off camp trips this summer.
- We will not be able to have any visitation on camp this summer. This includes our Parents Visiting Day.
- Staff will be arriving to camp for a longer orientation training/quarantine. Assuring us that our staff is properly trained on all of the new activities and safety protocols that are being implemented.
- All staff will be physically distancing throughout their staff orientation.

This summer at camp:

- Once a camper or staff member arrives to camp they will remain at camp throughout the summer.
- Cabin occupancy will be limited.
- Social distancing will not be required with the campers in your cabin.
- Campers will be traveling in smaller groups. They will be bunked according to the grade they will be entering in September.
- Meals in the dining room will be physically distanced and staggered with staggered entrance times by bunk so that there are not any lines built up. Tables will be distanced between bunks. Outdoor seating will also be utilized. Meals will be served family style by bunk with one of the bunk counselors serving the meal. Kitchen staff will be wearing masks and gloves while preparing the food.
- Physical distancing will occur as recommended by CDC and ACA guidelines.
- Face coverings will only be required if proper physical distance is not possible.
- We will not be participating in any large all camp activities indoors. Instead we are busy planning fun new activities in smaller group sizes.
- Activities will be held outdoors as often as possible.
- All departments will be cleaning their equipment between use of bunk groups.
- We will be increasing phone calls to twice per week for all campers so you will be able to talk to your child. You will receive a phone call schedule.
- After campers have been at camp for two weeks with no symptoms we will be able to ease some restrictions.

Campers and staff displaying symptoms:

- We will have a separate quarantine area available for anyone showing symptoms.
- Medical staff will be trained to identify all known Covid-19 symptoms.
- Anyone found to have suspected symptoms will be tested and parents will be notified prior to any test being administered.
- Campers in the cabin with suspected symptomatic camper will be contained as a cabin and stay with their cabin not mixing in with other groups and watched.
- Positive test will initiate contact tracing – monitor all possible exposures.
- Bunks with one positive case will be tested and isolated until results are returned.
- Entire bunk will be cleaned and sanitized.
- Campers with positive test results will be sent home.
- Out of region campers parents must provide a contact and agree to pick up their child within 24 hours of a positive test result.
